

### Communication and Language

- Read stories about farm, pet and wild animals. Both fiction and non-fiction.
- Learn new words, particularly relating to farm animals, pets and wild animals.
- Join in with songs and rhymes; 5 little ducks, old Macdonald etc.

### Physical Development

- Take part in activities involving hand eye co-ordination – puzzles, lacing, mark making and construction.
- Gain confidence by moving in various ways, pretending to be different animals – slither, stomp, crawl etc.
- Develop independence through trying to put on our own coats and shoes.

### Mathematics

- Count ducks, sheep and other animals.
- Recite some number names in order.
- Match quantity and number correctly.
- Learn new shapes and talk about patterns
